At Central Regional TAFE, three types of fees may be charged.

Course Fees

The course fee is the sum of fees for all units that a student enrolls in. An hourly rate based on nominal hours will apply to each unit commenced in 2019.

Resource Fees

Resource fees are charges for materials that are considered essential to a course or unit of study and which do not form part of the course fee.
