About this course

The White Card Skill Set is an induction skill set designed for those required by Occupational Safety and Health Regulations to provide competency, namely the construction industry.

The requirements for construction induction training apply to construction work.

The definition of construction work under the *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984* and Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996 is very broad and picks up a wide range of activities. The Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996 set out mandatory requirements for the provision of construction safety induction training, for employees or self-employed people doing construction work at a workplace in Western Australia.
