

Am I eligible?



Prior lecturing experience is not required. All you need is experience in your chosen industry and a passion for teaching your specialisation to others. We'll help you with the rest and even provide support and assistance for obtaining your Trainer and Assessor qualification.



- A minimum five years experience in your industry or area of specialisation
- Obtaining a satisfactory Department of Education Nationally Coordinated Criminal History Check
- A current and valid Working with Children Check
- Meeting citizenship / residency or visa requirements
- Appropriate industry and training and assessment qualifications



To be eligible to become a CRT Lecturer you must be able to demonstrate current vocational competency (broad industry knowledge and experience) at least to the level of the training package / qualification you will be delivering.

Lecturers are required to hold a (TAE40116) Certificate IV in Training and Assessment as a minimum. If you already have the qualification, fantastic! However, we will assist you to obtain your qualification, on the job, if you don't have it yet.



The teaching opportunities are endless! It could be anything from traditional trades like construction or plumbing to engineering, IT, hairdressing, health, marketing, cookery or teaching English as a second language. Check out the list of courses delivered at the campus you would like to work at.



No lecturing experience is necessary however you do need to be enthusiastic about sharing your knowledge, a good communicator, great at planning and organising and have the patience to help people to learn.
